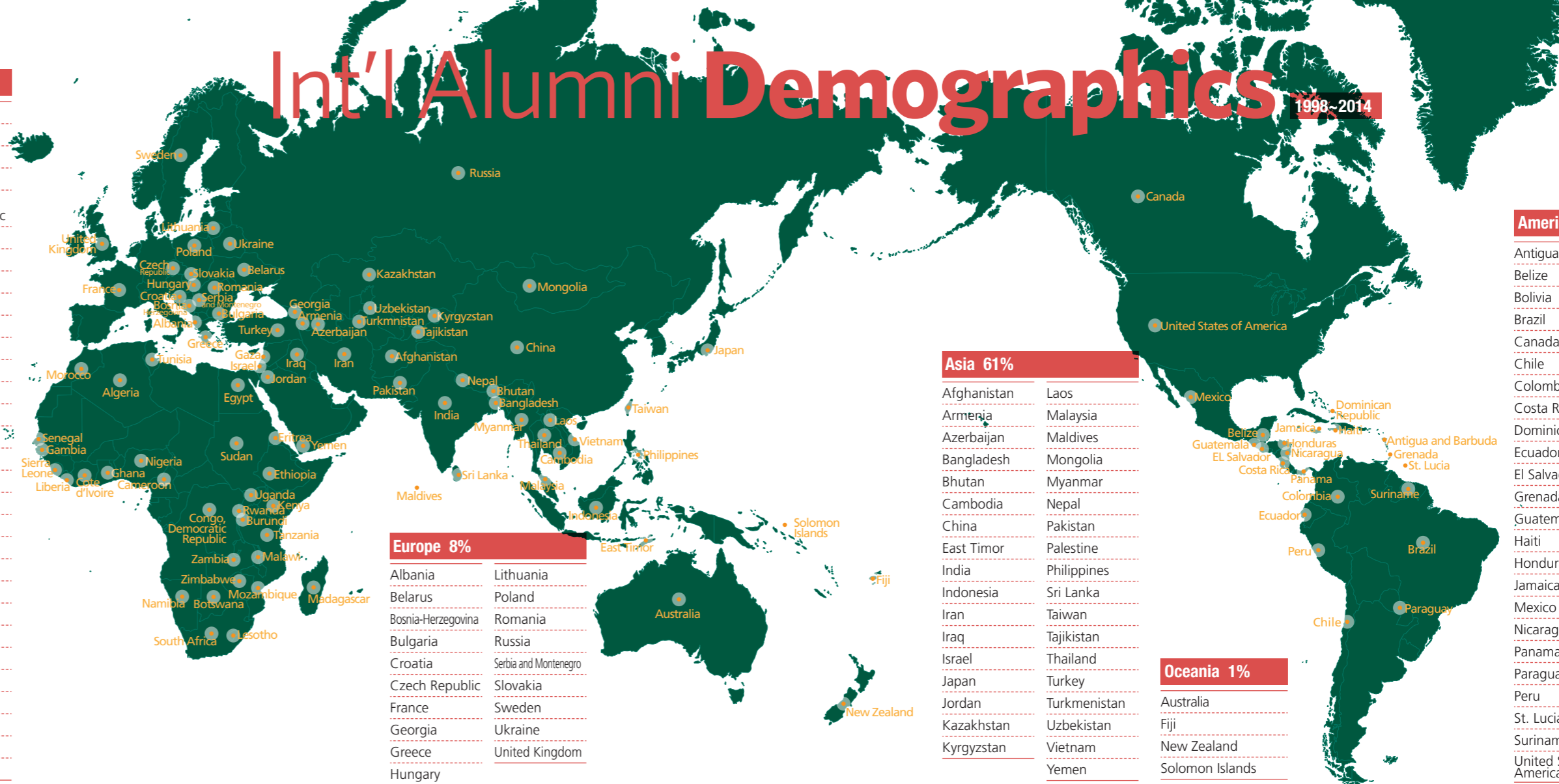

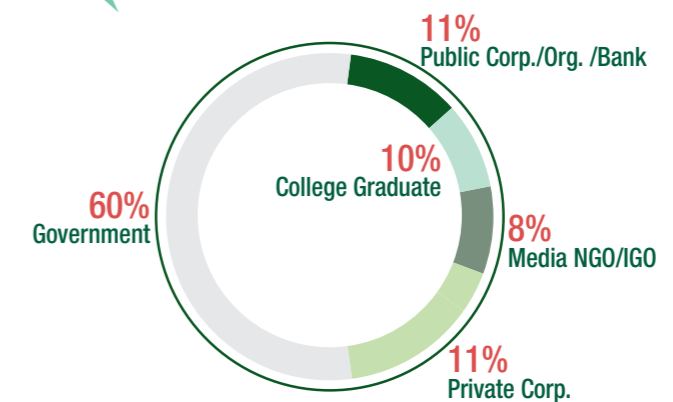
MDP Program

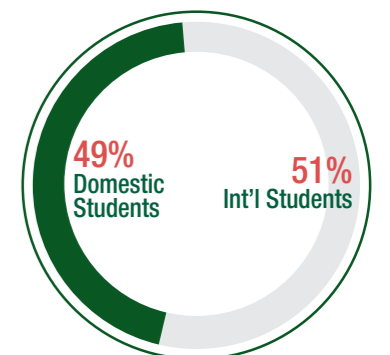

Scholarships

All international students receive scholarship and most scholarships include full tuition and monthly stipend (app. US\$1000/month).

Global Ambassador Scholarship

-Benefits: Full tuition and monthly stipend for most recipients

-Eligibility: All international students

-How to apply: Most international students enrolled in a full-time Master's program will become candidates for this scholarship.

Seoul G20 Global Leaders Fellowship

-Benefits: Full tuition, monthly stipend, and round-trip airfare

-Eligibility: Applicants should be currently employed in the public sector and meet one of the requirements below.

(1) Division head or higher level in the public sector

(2) Minimum 6 years of working experience in the public sector

-How to apply: Applicants must submit an online application for Seoul G20 Global Leaders Fellowship and required documents including an employment verification letter demonstrating his/her eligibility

Eligibility Requirements (Int'l Applicants for Master's programs)

-Hold a bachelor's or an equivalent degree*.

*The degree above should be obtained by August, 2015.

-Be a foreign national whose parents are both foreign nationals (or has completed at least 16 years of education in a foreign country).

-Be able to communicate in English.

Application Process
