E. Number of credits (ECTS)

Total amount of ECTS earned throughout the program equals **120**: 80 ECTS - for study component, 10 ECTS – research seminar and internship, 30 ECTS – master's thesis.

The length of study is 2 academic years, i.e. 4 academic semesters.

- **G. Prerequisites for the program:** an undergraduate degree or recognized equivalent qualification in any academic area. Some background in social sciences is an asset.

H. Qualification of the graduate program:

The interdisciplinary Master's Program in Gender Studies is the first and the only graduate level program in Gender Studies thoughout the Caucasus region. The Program has been developed in close cooperation with the Women's and Gender Studies Department at Rutgers University, New Jersew, USA, and the Department of Gender Studies at Central European University, Budapest, Hungary. Students of the Master's Program in Gender Studies have a unique opportunity to receive a graduate level training in Social Sciences meeting international standards; learn about the issues of gender equality from socio-economic and political perspective, as well as historic aspects of women's rights and feminist theories.

The program is interdisciplinary and aims at:

- Providing students with uptodate knowledge on gender as a social, cultural, political, and economic phenomenon;
- Developing skills of critical thinking and inquiry;
- Preparing them for practical work on gender concerns.

Program Structure and content:

The degree requires 120 ECTS credits and will take two calendar years (four semesters). The curriculum takes an integrated approach by combining theoretical and applied courses. In the first and second semesters students are required to earn 30 ECTS (total of 60 ECTS in both semesters); in the third semester students are required to earn more 25 ECTS from the study component, as well as take internship and undergo intensive on-job training at the government agencies, local NGOs/think tanks, research institutes or international organizations (5 ECTS). In the fourth semester the students work closely with their research supervisor to prepare Graduate thesis. In

the begining of the semester, students are required to pass pre-defense of the research proposal. In case of positive evaluation, students can continue working on their theses. Theses must feature the students' own research, and be defended in late June (30 ECTS).

Classes are small (less than 20 students) and include lectures and seminars given by Georgian and international faculty who have considerable academic and practical experience working in Universities, NGOs, think tanks and Government. Teaching will be collaborative, student-centered and skill-based.

J. Methods to achieve the learning outcomes

The mentioned outcomes are achieved by the program curriculum and course syllabi. The course designs are aimed at giving theortical knowledge, as well as developing skills for research, academic writing, oral communication and presentation, participation in academic debates, working as a team member. Besides working on the number of texts, students are expected to write analytical esseys, reviews, prepare presentations, participate in debates, prepare group homeworks.

Several courses, as well as master's thesis, encompasses conducting of independent research and presenting the results in written form; one of the courses requires the preparation of practical project proposal; others require writing policy papers. All of these courses aim at developing skills to apply theoretical knowledge in everyday, practical activities.

Since the majority of the courses are about gender inequality, they develop the values connected with social justice, responsibility, requiring transparent public policy. The courses with more theoretical focus, are aiming at developing research skills and applying theoretical methods to actual research.

M. Admission Requirements

- Candidates who have BA degree or HE 5 year studies graduation diploma in any field are eligible to apply. However, some knowledge of social sciences is an asset. Fourth grade students expecting to graduate in summer are eligible to apply;
- National Graduate Exams (for Georgian applicants only. Non-resident applicants should submit the documentations to the Ministry of Education and Science accordingly to decree # 725 to be admitted on the program without passing National Graduate Exams);
- English language proficiency level B2 demonstrated either by taking the corresponding examination at TSU Language Center or submitting standardized English Language test scores (TOEFL IBT 87 or equivalent on IELTS, Cambridge, etc.);
- Complete application package: TSU application form; certified copies and translations (if applicable) of Bachelor's degree certificate/Diploma, transcripts, language test scores if any, copy of ID card/ passport;
- documents certifying status regarding the military service (for Georgian male applicants only).

The applicants will be admitted based on the written examination (preparation materials and examination topics are available on ftp server of Center for Social Sciences: ftp.ucss.ge) and interview with the admission committee.
