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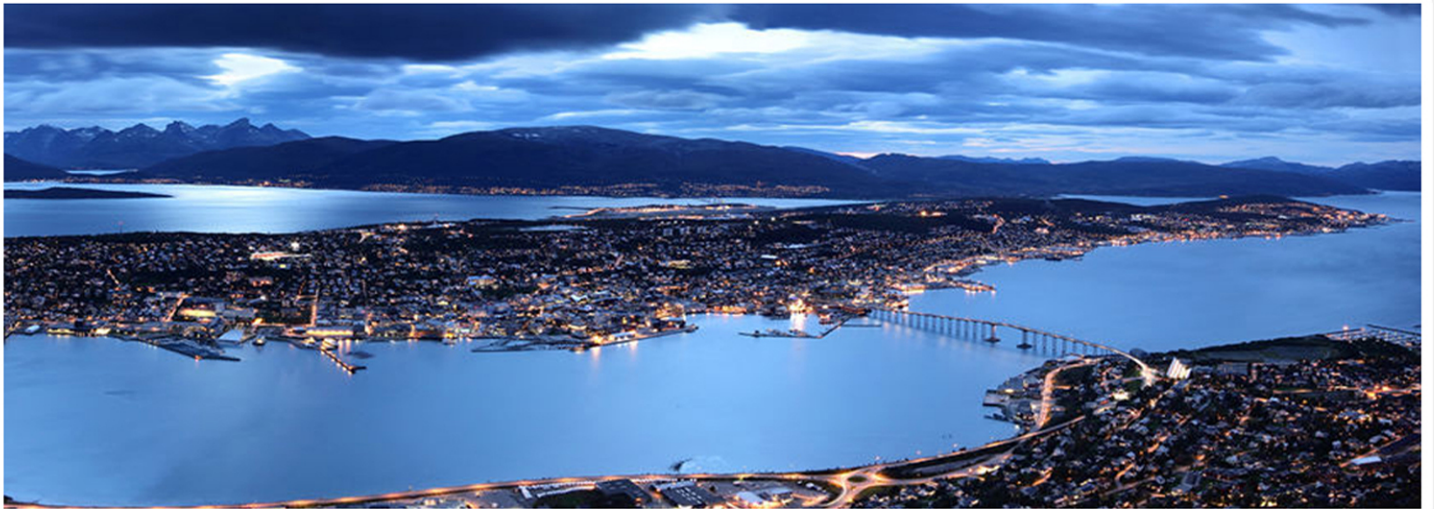

Information about the SIU

The Norwegian Center for International Cooperation in Education (SIU) with The Norwegian Cooperation Programme in Higher Education with Eurasia supports project cooperation between institutions in Norway and Georgia, Ukraine, Moldova, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan for 2015-2020. The overall goal of the Eurasia Programme is to contribute to renewal and internationalization of higher education in the cooperating countries.

By the application deadline 26.10.2015, the Cooperation Program with Eurasia had received 37 eligible applications for project funding within the field of higher education. 13 proposals were supported, among the selected applications was CPEA-2015/10057 Project „Georgian-Norwegian Collaborative in Public Health (GeNoC-PH)”. The duration of the project is 4 years.

Information about the Project

The overall goal of the project is to increase public health competence in Georgia by developing a new, international, high-quality Master program in Public Health (MPH) with special focus on register-based epidemiology. The project further aims to educate students on master and doctoral level to utilize the large amount of data generated from newly developed national health registries in Georgia. Furthermore, this project will also enhance knowledge transfer between Norway and Georgia in terms of register-based epidemiology and public health.

Two selected PhD students will acquire invaluable knowledge in register-based research by utilizing the newly implemented Georgian medical registries in their PhD research and will graduate within the project period in both Georgia and Norway. It is intended, that students and staff members take part in short and long term mobility between the teaching institutions for individual courses, joint courses, semester exchange and supervision. Through UNICEF support and in collaboration with The Arctic University of Norway/The University of Tromsø (UiT), National Center for Disease Control and Public Health (NCDC) and Consulting & IT Innovations (CiTi) the Georgian Birth Registry (GBR) was created, which was officially launched on January 1, 2016. The GBR is projected to register around 60 000 births each year, thereby generating an enormous amount of data that has the potential to improve the entire nation's antenatal care situation.

Sharing of competence, internships, possible product development, course development and educational commitments will increase the chance that graduates meet current labor market needs and increase employment opportunities.
